Southern Alberta Energy from Waste Association is pleased to announce by way of this letter of introduction to its members, that we will be working in coordination with HDR Corporation (HDR) and appointed field coordinator representatives from 2 sg lnc. (2cg) in the upcoming weeks to expedite completion of select (4) 100 kg. field waste audits / sampling events to be carried out in member waste authority areas.

Please be advised that the winter waste audits were identified based on the qualitative data analysis and findings compiled from the Waste Stream Survey results completed on December 4, 2015.

We wish to engage the following waste authorities:

- 1. Drumheller & District Solid Waste Management Association
- 2. Newell Regional Solid Waste Management Authority Ltd.
- 3. Vulcan District Waste Commission; and
- 4. Lethbridge Regional Waste Management Services Commission

Note: the waste audits are being scheduled in the second or third weeks of January 2016; these are to be scheduled exactly based on the coordination of logistics which are expected to take place prior to end December 2015. 2cg Field Coordinator, Stacy Schaub-Szabo as designated by HDR will be in direct contact with the appointed waste authority representatives to discuss logistical requirements. At the site of each waste audit the following will be required: Heated waste sample storage area (approximately 20'*20'); the delivery of four waste samples to the sorting area by each municipality and the removal of sorted wastes.

The SAEWA membership is looking forward to the beneficial report of results which will be received from these field analysis events.
